



The story of Eneabha

When 23 year old Doug Brooks recognised an opportunity to hire out equipment to the mining industry in WA in 1979, he knew it was something he had to pursue. With no business experience but plenty of ambition, young Doug scrambled together every dollar he had to purchase two disassembled compressors, with the remainder of the bill being settled by bankcard.



At the time, Doug was working 12 hour days as a Fitter on Barrow Island, and he fixed the unserviceable compressors in his spare time. After a few months of paying off his debts, Doug then made the bold decision to leave his job as a Fitter and start his own hire business.





He opened 'Brooks Hire Service' and ran the business from a shed in the remote WA town of Eneabba. All the while Doug was living in a 'humpy' at the rear of the shed. There were many that warned him of the difficulty of starting a new business in a very competitive industry, but Doug was determined and it was only a matter of time before he was turning a profit on his compressors.

What started as two compressors on hire, soon turned into twelve pumps on hire, but the turning point came when Doug purchased his first piece of mobile equipment, an eight tonne JEC crane. The crane was purchased by tender in Perth and Doug didn't have the \$500 needed to freight the crane to Eneabba, so he drove it for 13 hours to get it there himself, with his trusty dog on board of course. This is a testament to the lengths that Doug would go, to ensure the success of Brooks Hire.

Moving The Humpy There are many great stories that came out of that shed in Eneabba. It was the foundation of Brooks Hire and the place where all of the 'hard yards' were done. Doug would work long hours during the week, and then drive to Perth on the weekend for parts. It was

during one of these trips that he met his future wife, Roma.





By 1983, with the business continuing to grow, and Doug pursuing his life with Roma, Brooks Hire set up shop in Hogarth Street, Cannington. Then in 1990, they purchased their own yard in Canning Vale, where the Head Office is still located today. But it is that shed in Eneabba that will be remembered as the birth place of Brooks Hire Service.

Brooks RISE To The Top!

Wow! What a way to end the year. Throughout 2021, three new divisions were added to the Brooks Group, new premises were purchased, new staff were employed, a major dealership was formed, and all of this culminated in Brooks Hire winning the RISE Business Awards Large Business of the Year Award.

Hosted by Business News, the RISE Business Awards celebrates Western Australian businesses and their achievements. Originally launched in 2003 as the Rising Star Awards, Business News remodelled the criteria in 2020 to take into account the challenges that businesses faced in the new Covid-19 landscape.

RISE is an acronym for Resourcefulness, Imagination, Sustainability, and Excellence. In 2021, entrants were required to demonstrate all four of these elements with a focus on Rethinking Business. The submission process asked entrants how their business responded to challenges, embraced opportunities, and remained sustainable to be future-ready in an evolving landscape. Detailed examples of strategy, capability, and commitment were also a part of the judging criteria. In its biggest year so far, Business News received 136 entries to the 2021 RISE Business Awards.

The awards ceremony was held on Thursday 2nd December at the Crown Grand Ball room. Approximately 700 guests were treated to champagne on arrival, closely followed by an entree of smoked salmon while all girl band 'Glam' got the party atmosphere started to a cover of Kylie Minogue's 'I'm Spinning Around'.

For the second year running, Brooks Hire was nominated in the Large Business of the Year category for businesses with more than 100 full-time equivilent staff that have been trading for at least three financial years. In 2020, we were honoured to be short-listed as a finalist in this category, with UON being announced as the winner.

This time around, the finalists in the Large Business of the Year category were Brooks Hire Service, Mader Group, Capricorn Society, Perth Airport, and Aquatic Leisure Technologies.

The excitement in the room was palpable as everyone waited to hear who would be the 2021 winner of the highly coveted award. When 'Brooks Hire Service' was called, Doug Brooks sprung from his chair and proudly made his way to the stage, as the 'Brooks' table cheered excitedly.

Georgiou's Expansion Reaches New Heights

For National civil and building company, Georgiou Group, FY22 has started with a bang with the Australian-owned company securing several iconic infrastructure projects across the country.

"The infrastructure investment from the Federal and State Governments COVID-19 response has increased our prospects pipeline to circa \$10 billion and the company is taking a steady approach to growing our work-in-hand and capacity to deliver," explains CEO Rob Monaci.

"We are also seeing renewed confidence in the private sector with increased project opportunities in the resources, building and land development sectors."

Opportunities have flourished with the company recently being awarded the Stage 1 Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade (valued at \$183 million) and Parkes Bypass (valued at circa \$115 million).

Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade

In November, the company was awarded the contract to deliver Stage 1 (Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade) of the \$183 million Moggill Road Corridor Upgrade project by repeat client, Brisbane City Council.

Scope of works involves construction of an overpass, from Coonan Street over Moggill Road, which will improve traffic flow, safety and active transport options as well as cater to existing and future traffic demands.

Eastern Region Executive General Manager Gary Georgiou said the award of this project comes just months after Georgiou reached practical completion on the successful Indooroopilly Riverwalk project.

"At Georgiou, we pride ourselves on delivering technically complex projects and this one will be no different."



"From a community perspective, the project borders commercial, retail and residential properties and with more than 55,000 vehicles through the roundabout each day, it's important we minimise disruption as much as possible," he explains.

"Having delivered projects for Brisbane City Council, our team has a solid understanding of what the client expects and we will work hard to ensure we deliver, and where possible, exceed their expectations on this critical project."

Construction, which will see 85 internal personnel at peak, will

commence immediately with works expected to be completed in



The \$187.2 million Newell Highway upgrade, Parkes Bypass project in NSW, involves relocating the highway about two kilometres west, between Maguire Road to the north and Barkers Road to the south, a total length of 10.5 kilometres.

The project team - which will employ 120 at peak - will construct two new bridges, new intersections, a four-way roundabout as well as the realignment and reconfiguration of local roads in the

Mr Georgiou said it was very important all construction projects are delivered in accordance with the NSW Public Health Orders and the company's strong COVID management plans.

"As with any construction project in NSW – or anywhere in Australia - it's extremely important for Georgiou that our stringent COVID protocols remain in place for the safety of our people, those working on our projects and, most importantly, the local community,"

"In addition to daily temperature testing and COVID management plans, the Parkes project will have an appointed COVID marshal on site and movements - of staff and subcontractors - will be limited to reduce any risk of COVID transmission."





COVID-19 response

The health, safety and wellbeing of their people, as well as the general public, has remained the company's priority.

"Throughout the year, our COVID Management Team has reacted swiftly and decisively to COVID-19 with a clear strategy to keep people safe, support employees (regardless of where they are located) and continue to deliver our projects for our clients. In NSW, our office-based employees were encouraged to work from home as the construction industry paused as works on our projects were temporarily suspended," said CEO Rob Monaci.

"In true Georgiou style, projects ramped up – in line with the NSW Government Public Health Order - with the teams going above what was advised to minimise transmission and protect one another. I couldn't be prouder of how our teams adapted during this difficult time and want to thank our COVID Management Team who meet at all hours of the day and over weekends to ensure we were communicating the very latest direction to our team of 900."

McNally Group Reap The Rewards

This quarter, we caught up with Mark McNally from McNally Group to talk about the construction industry in a Covid world. Mark gave us some insights into how McNally Group has handled the situation, and the benefits his company has experienced despite the disruptions that Covid-19 has caused.

Tell us a bit about the history of McNally. Where did it all begin?

McNally was founded in 2009 and is a locally owned and operated family business. Originally set up to solely manufacture modular buildings, today we provide a true turnkey solution in the design and construction of mining villages and non-process infrastructure in the mining and resources space.

Can you tell us about the journey from there to where you are today?

Of course. In the first few years, manufacturing was going gang busters with our facilities in Henderson running at full capacity. But, as anyone who's ever run a business will tell you, the only constant in business is change.

We could see there was a real requirement in the industry for a genuine self-performing, full turnkey solution provider. So, between 2011 and 2012 we set up our construction division including full internal management teams.

In 2012, the market changed. The iron ore price was trending down which brought with it a change in the priorities of our customers. Suddenly, the market shifted away from new modular buildings, now, it was all about refurbishment and site upgrades, basically making old new again. Fortunately, our earlier decision to establish a construction arm had paid off, we were well positioned for the change

Since 2012 we've worked on many notable projects utilising McNally's full capabilities including the recommissioning and refurbishment of the 1000-person Christmas Creek construction camp for Fortescue, the design and construction of the 850-person Agnew Village for Gold Fields Australia and more recently the design, construct and refurbishment of the Mount Holland 550-person village for Covalent Lithium.



McNally has been privileged to work with these clients, as well as many others over the last 12 years in delivering a diverse range of projects that we, as group are extremely proud of. We pride ourselves on the fact that many of our customers today are repeat customers and we look forward to delivering for them many more times in the future.

Today, I can tell you that McNally is working on several projects with industry heavy weights to deliver the next level of mining village. The increased level of amenity, comfort and general usability will mark a complete 180° turnabout from the industries priorities in 2012 and deliver a far greater user experience than anything offered previously. These designs will ensure the attraction and retention of a top-quality workforce.

The pandemic has affected the construction industry differently around the country. What are some of the positive effects and/or negative challenges that McNally has faced?

There's no question that Covid has brought with it several challenges as well as opportunities. Border closures brought supply chain disruption and workforce shortages, social distancing has led to a change in the way we communicate and work each day. We've been quite fortunate really; our business requires that our construction teams need to work from remote locations around Western Australia already. Adapting our business to allow for the remote working of our office-based teams was a natural next step in the evolution of our business, and the application of those same processes to our office team worked very well. Even before the pandemic, we had begun applying the necessary steps to allow our people the freedom to work from home.

At McNally we have found our pillars of Mateship, Equality and

Teamwork have shown through. The one thing that has remained steadfast throughout this pandemic is a commitment to our people, subcontractors, suppliers, and clients. It's this commitment that has enabled McNally to attract and retain the best people, ensure supply chains remain intact and that our clients' projects are completed on time.

It's not often that you meet someone who is as passionate about their equipment as they are about their projects, however that's exactly what we found when we caught up with Kenneth Dolan from Dolan Civil.

Dolan Civil is one of the leading Civil Construction companies in the Northern Territory, so we were interested to hear about the company, their projects, and what drove them to be so successful.

Dolan Civil was established in 2014. Tell us how it all began, what was your motivation for starting the business?

I started the business by purchasing a 14 tonne wheeled excavator, more commonly known in the civil industry as a Rubberduck. There was very few of these machines in the territory at the time and very few people knew how efficient the Rubberduck could be



Previous to starting the business I was fortunate to be able to showcase the Rubberduck to my employer at the time. He agreed to hire it to finish off the project we were working on. It was a huge success! The nature of the project meant that there were multiple work fronts open at at any one time. The Rubberduck could easily mobilise to any of these work fronts in a short period of time.

When it came to starting my own business, the motivation was simple. We wanted to give clients a new perspective on how to approach tasks, and be more efficient. Using Rubberducks over a traditional tracked excavator gave us more options in regards to mobility.

Another major advantage to using the Rubberduck is the many different attachments that can be used including rockbreakers, rock grinders, grabs, bucket brooms, vibe plates, pallet forks and slashers. Our Rubberducks also come with the latest Trimble GPS machine control technology.

Following the opening of Dolan Civil in 2014, Kenneth Dolan was joined by his brothers Bob and Conor. The business is a real family affair now.

What services do you offer, and what locations do you cover?

Our Civil Contracting services include road building, service installation, concreting, bulk earthworks, haulage, landscaping, and remediation. We also offer wet plant hire. Dolan Civil have covered projects all over the Northern Territory.

What is it about Dolan Civil that differentiates you from your competitors?

Dolan Civil have a team of highly skilled personnel, with a vast knowledge of the local civil industry. Building strong client relationships is a big focus for our team. We pride ourselves on the highest standard of workmanship. However, the big differentiator is our fleet. What has been your most challenging project to date?

In 2020 Dolan Civil were awarded Stage 2 of the RAAf Tindal Stormwater Remediation package by head contractors DDR. This involved the remediation of 50km of open lined drains, underground culverts and stormwater piping. The project was unique as this was the first time these works had been undertaken since the base had been built. The biggest challenge we faced was completing the program for works before the end of dry season. Up here in the Northern Territory, the weather often dictates the progress of your work. We were successful in completing the challenge.







What is the outlook for the construction industry in the NT, are there plenty of projects in the pipeline?

The construction industry in the NT is looking very positive at the moment. There is a big emphasis on upgrading local Defence Bases which we have been a big part of. In addition to this, and our clients outside of Defence, we see a busy few years ahead.



What's on the horizon for Dolan Civil? Where do you see your business in 5 years from now?

Our motto is quality over quantity, so that's what we'll be focusing on. By keeping our work to the highest possible standard and making sure our clients are 100% satisfied, we are confident that the company will grow accordingly. We also place a high degree of value in the quality of our team so we'll be making sure that as the company grows, we maintain this quality within our workforce.

In 2022, the Great Harley Draw will be open to our clients from Brooks Equipment, Brooks Access, and Brooks Transport.



























Cisco's Kitchen **BBO Ribs on Charcoal Slow Cook Grill**

This edition, our Sydney Salesman, Francisco Lagos has taken over Vinny's Kitchen. "This recipe is the version we serve in my house in the south of Chile, Patagonia area, next to Andes Mountains, volcanos, and beautiful lakes. We share this BBQ with our friends and family, enjoy a beer or wine and the time together. Make sure you keep the kids involved. This is my son Orlando, 3 years old helping with the coal to start the BBQ."



Ingredients

1 set of Beef Short Ribs (2.5 - 3kgs) 1-2 Corn Cobs 4-6 Potatoes

2-3 Bottles of your favorite Beer

1. Marinate the meat with Rub Ingredients for at least 40 minutes prior to cooking.

1. Pre-heat the Coal BBQ to 130° celcius.

2. Put 200ml of water in a roasting tray, then add the beef ribs.

3. Put the roasting tray on the BBQ grill and leave for 2 hours.

4. After the meat has been grilling for 2 hours, peel the corn, spread with butter & a pinch of salt and wrap in foil. Then clean the potatoes, add butter & a pinch of garlic and wrap in foil. Add the vegetables to the grill.

5. Continue to cook for around 1 hr.

6. After a total cooking time of 3 to 3.5 hrs remove the ribs and let them rest for 15 minutes.

7. Cut the meat and serve with the vegies and a beer or wine.
